Past Master's Corner



My first recollection of the Masonic Order was as a child when my father would take us on vacations. I would see the Trestle boards as we entered certain towns with the Masonic, Moose, Elks, Chamber of Commerce and others on the boards. I pretty much forgot about that but in High School we use to play sports against Moose heart, which was for Moose families who were having problems. When I moved to Key West, there was a Moose and I was invited to join. I joined only to find out is was basically a place to get cheap drinks and play games, more like a bar. That was not my desire to be part of so I dropped my membership after only one year.

Next after spending time in Puerto Rico and moving to Orlando I had a customer come in to my Model Railroad Hobby Shop with Masonic Shirts and hats on. I finally stopped him one day and asked what it was all about. He told me about the Masons, about Scottish Rite, and Shriners Hospitals. He went on further and told me that no booze, religion, or politics are allowed in the lodge. I finally asked the right questions back in the early 1990's, how does one become a Mason. Well want do you know, I got an application, had an investigation, and reported for duty at the Winter Park 239 Lodge. I was made an Entered Apprentice, Fellow craft, and finally raised to Master Mason there. Shortly after that I joined the Scottish Rite and Shrine. Within a year a new Lodge was going to start on the South West Side of Orlan-

do. Since I lived on the South West side I demitted and was a charter member of the Robert Schugardt Lodge. We met at the Orange Tree Country Club where we had a room, and I made most of the equipment. I had the staffs, the holders, the G, The visual bocks, and of course the ashlars. Interesting at the stone we used was from a sailing ship as ballast which had sailed from England to Boston or New Bedford MA and were now being used as Street cobble stones. When I was a Captain with PBA, we would go out and move stones from one project to another just to mess with them. Well, I left one in my trunk unknown until I got home. We had that block cut in two, one polished and one rough so they were prefect.

I was hired by American Airlines in Dallas/Fort Worth, TX and moved there in December 1999. I stayed a member or the Schugardt Lodge and also joined the Smithfield Lodge in North Richland Hills, TX. It is a Free and Ancient Lodge plus they do a lot of stuff for Texas. Very confusing. While a member I broke my right Tibia and Tibia bones in my right leg. After nearly 4 months not one call or visit from a Brother out there. I was very disappointed and never went back. I did get laid off in 2004 and since my wife had a house in Tampa we sold the house in Texas and put everything into Storage. I moved to Tampa and joined the Temple Terrace Lodge. I was in line and moved up to the Junior Deacon Position in the 3 years I was there, and was recalled to American Airlines. I went back and finished my career At American Airlines until 2015 all while being a continuing member of the Temple Terrace Lodge. When I retired I moved to Winter Garden and my wife, Ann, looked up the nearest Masonic Lodge which was Winter Garden Lodge. Robert Schugardt and Winter Garden had become one lodge and I found myself right back where I started.

I started over in the line and moved through the two Stewards positions, then to Junior Deacon for a year under Clawson Peacock. Due to some brothers that had shortened cable tows positions opened up and I was moved to Senior Warden to fill the position for about 4 months. I puttered around the Lodge doing projects in 1917 and 2018, In 2018, I was elected Worshipful Master. In all my travels I have noted that a person can do an ok job, but successful managers that make a team always seem to do better to outstanding jobs. We elected to create a team effort to make Winter Garden really stand out. We created the "Blue Feather" team, using a blue feather because Blue is the Masonic Color. Further I said that a bird cannot fly with a single feather as in a Worshipful Master working alone. It took all his feathers in order to soar to new heights. I had given each of my officers and assigned members of the team a blue feather plus the poem I had written. Due to the devastation of our line I insisted on getting each of our aspiring line members qualified and ready for their next positions such as degree work. We had a wonderful year with record income, record participation, cave degree participation, fantastic 4th of July parade, road clean ups with W. Mike Kramer, fantastic rentals and parking lot income. Our Haunted House set the bar even higher than before, at Christmas time we received a first place trophy unexpectedly. Our lodge was noted as being a leader in our District; our academic levels were rising with Master Mason 1-2-3 and MLT's being completed. Our new sign on the outside was completed, two new A/C units installed with the help of W. Clawson Peacock. Our lot was cleaned up. We must be very proud of what we have accomplished, what we had contributed to, and to those who we were able to help out. We became a closer family, a Masonic Family of brothers who care for each other like I have never seen before. Little did I know that right around the corner was a Pandemic that our next Worshipful Master, and all of us would have to deal with. From that unforeseen disaster or ashes, a new Phoenix will rise to soar again.
